Mass Readings for this Sunday 14th May

Acts 6:1-7

During the earliest days of the Christian community, when the number of new members was increasing almost exponentially, the apostles did not allow themselves to be distracted from their priorities of praying and preaching the word of God. Could it be that, with the rapidly-diminishing number of practising members in today's Church – especially in the developed world – that the tasks of praying and preaching the word of God need to be re-prioritised?

1 Peter 2:4-9

God's love for us is so great that he has made us a 'chosen race', a 'royal priesthood', a 'consecrated nation' and a 'people set apart'. That is why we are a privileged people. But with privileges come responsibilities. Those responsibilities centre on our fidelity to the commandments that God has given us to transform us into the kind of people that he intended us to be.

John 14:1-12

We live in an increasingly post-truth society where many of us no longer instinctively trust other people – because our trust has previously been exploited. We are not sure what the truth is anymore because there are often contradictory versions. Yet Jesus asks us to continue to trust in God and to accept that, not alone does he bring the truth but that he is the way, the truth and the life. This is a demanding challenge, especially when the very existence and goodness of God are doubted by so many people.
