**Mass Readings for this Sunday 11th June**

**Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9**

In the aftermath of the golden calf incident, Moses begs the Lord to go with his people, despite their stubbornness and infidelity, and unable to promise that it won't happen again. In our own lives, it may feel as though we could never ask for God's help in light of our past behaviour. And yet, God delivers the Jewish people to the Promised Land. His forgiveness knows no end.

**2 Corinthians 13:11-13**

The dissent of the Israelites in the desert is mirrored in the first Christian community of Corinth. Community life is not easy and requires effort. St Paul urges the Corinthians to find common ground, lay their issues to rest and act according to Gospel values. A tall order indeed. Yet the Lord has set a precedent. He will remain with us on our journey, wherever it takes us.

**John 3:16-18**

This section of John's Gospel is undoubtedly one of the best known. It is so well-known, in fact, that our familiarity may inhibit our understanding. 'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son'. This is the very basis of Christianity, nothing new there. And yet, when we sit quietly with these words, the reality begins to infuse in a new way. Our God gave his Son, his very self, to show us the way to full and eternal life, to lead us in living well and embracing our divinity, to bring us to spiritual fulfilment and an understanding of what our life truly means. This love is absolute. It holds nothing back.
