CASTLE & GARDENS AND  
ARUNDEL MUSEUM**

Wednesday 13th September  
Leaving at 9.00, returning by 6.30

Set high on a hill in West Sussex, this great Castle commands the landscape with magnificent views across the South Downs and the River Arun. Founded at the end of the 11th Century, it has been the family home of the Dukes of Norfolk and their ancestors for nearly 1000 years. Almost completely rebuilt in the 19th century, the magnificent architecture in Gothic style is considered to be one of the great works of Victorian England. There are stunning walled gardens, a peach house and vinery, cut flower garden and organic kitchen garden. Cost: £32 each. Bookings to the Parish Office please.

**Mass Readings for this  
Sunday 13th August**

**1 Kings 19:9, 11-13**

Like all his compatriots, Elijah's faith and trust in God had been shattered. Powerful invading armies had exiled the Hebrews to Babylon and had even destroyed the Temple. The God who had solemnly promised to be with them always to protect them from every harm had failed them utterly. Dispirited and nearly broken, Elijah was running from it all. The incident at Horeb in today's reading is to remind us that our God is not found in strong power but in the ordinary things of daily life like a gentle breeze.

**Romans 9:1-5**

St Paul was an ardent lover. He had two great loves in his life. He deeply appreciated how God had blessed his people. His second love that fired him even more intensely was the love of Christ. He was tormented by the refusal of his fellow Jews to respond to the love of Jesus Christ. Paul would probably die for either love.

**Matthew 14:22-33**

Matthew's Gospel may be particularly suited to our time of storms in the Church. In his Gospel, Matthew's focus is on Jesus forming the disciples into a little community, the core of the young Church to be. So, just as Jesus came in the midst of the storm to reassure his disciples, so he is there for the infant Church that is frightened by the challenges it faces, torn by desertions and afraid of going down in a hostile sea.
