#### **MASS READINGS FOR THIS SUNDAY 14th January 2018**

##### **1 Samuel 3:3-10,19**

The contrasts between Eli and Samuel are noteworthy: Eli is old and Samuel young; Eli's sight is failing and Samuel's hearing is sharp; Eli comes from a priestly tribe and Samuel was dedicated to God by his mother; Eli is wise and experienced while Samuel is inexperienced. Israel is on the verge of darkness and someone they least expect is called to leadership. The narrative illustrates how easy it is to miss God's voice and how often we need the ears and wisdom of another to enable us to understand the meaning in what is taking place.

##### **1 Corinthians 6: 13-15, 17-20**

St Paul reminds us that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit. He challenges us to reflect on our lifestyle and what we do to enable our bodies to be as healthy as possible. But our bodies are more than the physical. They hold the essence of who we are and carry the deepest yearnings of our hearts. Our invitation is to treat the body in a way that leads to the fullness of life.

##### **John 1:35-42**

John presents a narrative not found in Mark's gospel. On the basis of John the Baptist's affirmation of Jesus, some of John's disciples had a desire to know Jesus better, so they left John to follow Jesus. They want to find out for themselves who he is and where he lives. They are not just interested in his physical place of residence but where he lives in his heart-space. They are ready to embark on a journey that will take them deeper into the depth of Jesus' heart.
