Mass Readings for 1st July 2018 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wisdom 1:13-15,2:23-24

Wisdom seeks to give an explanation of the value of the Jewish faith in light of increasing Hellenistic influence. This reflection on a clash of cultures makes it a valuable text, especially in today's world. The reading includes one of the Book's central themes of Judaism's understanding of life after death. More than that, it speaks to us of our truest nature, one that is in the image of the divine, one that is meant for eternal life.

2 Corinthians 8:7,9,13-15

We hear Paul calling on the community to share their abundance with the community in Jerusalem, echoing the generosity of spirit shown by Christ. For Paul it's a question of balance in life, where we help meet the needs of others with the understanding that one day the situation may well be reversed.

Mark 5:21-43

This reading is a Marcan 'sandwich,' whereby the Evangelist begins one story, interpolates it with another, before concluding the first. The theme of wholeness in our true human nature is continued here. We see both the woman with a haemorrhage and the girl restored to health and life, for sickness and death were never part of God's plan. Jesus offers each one of us the gift of eternal life.
