### Mass Readings for 8th July 2018 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### EZEKIEL 2: 2-5

This reading reminds us of God's faithfulness and the way he continues to reach out to us through his prophets, even if at times we may struggle to listen to what He has to say.

#### 2 CORINTHIANS 12: 7-10

It is in Paul's desperation he really encounters the grace of God, for it is when he is weak that he is strong.

#### MARK 6: 1-6

One imagines that following Jesus' miraculous works and profound teaching he would be welcomed openly anywhere, most especially by his own community and family. In the Gospel of Mark this is most certainly not the case. His words fall on deaf ears and the people are unable to see him as anything other than the 'son of the carpenter.' These are the people who should know him best, but they are blind to the identity of the person they've known all their lives. We're told he healed a few sick people, but could work no miracle due to their lack of faith. The necessity of people being open to the working of the divine is a recurring theme in Mark.
