MEMORIAL FOR CANON FRANK

Over the months since Canon Frank died many people have asked about the possibility of having a permanent memorial to him here. I completely endorse this idea and to this end I have instructed the sculptor of the statue of Our Lady in the church to create a new statue of Our Lady, or the Holy Family. It is proposed that it will be situated in the garden area to the left of the drive as you enter the car park and thus will be very visible. Seating will be provided around the statue so that people may sit and pray. A plaque of dedication will be on one of the seats.

Mass Readings for 29th July 2018 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

2 Kings 4: 42-44

A miracle of multiplication of bread is worked through the prophet Elisha and becomes more than enough to satisfy the needs of all. God, in his graciousness, provides generously for human hunger - of body and spirit.

Ephesians 4: 1-6

God, in his graciousness, has been generous to us and we, in turn, are to be generous in our living of the life he calls us to, especially in our efforts to build up the Christian community. Paul implores the Christians of Ephesus to lead a life worthy of their baptismal calling. We may not feel we have much to offer, but if we give from a willing heart, it will build up the body of Christ to the glory of the Father.

John 6: 1-15

From today, and for the next four Sundays, the continuous reading of St Mark's Gospel for Cycle B is interrupted and instead we listen to and reflect on the sixth chapter of St John's Gospel, Jesus' teaching on the Bread of Life. The chapter begins with the miracle of the loaves and fishes. What seems an inadequate offering of five barley loaves and two fish is freely given and shared, and proves more than enough to satisfy the hunger of the crowd. In the Eucharist, we remember that Jesus offered himself completely for the salvation of all. He is the Bread of Life that satisfies the deepest hungers of the human heart.
