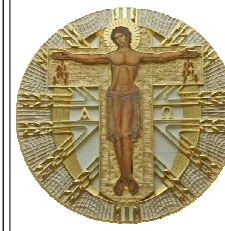

Mass Readings for 23rd September 2018 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

WISDOM 2:12,17-20

This extract gives very good insights into evil in the face of good and the efforts engaged in to undermine good. The word godless summarised the activities of the evil ones towards the good godly person. Who could have the ambition to be godless?

JAMES 3:16-4:3

James reveals that what goes on inside the human mind and heart is key to much. Jesus with his statement 'out of a man's heart comes all kinds of evil' surely inspired James in this. Praying properly will give the wisdom to live in God's way and to face evil.

MARK 9: 30-37

The disciples do not know Jesus fully yet and are slightly edgy about what he says and what they say to him. They cannot accept that he is to die. They have that inner political and secular notion of his purpose, which he is at pains, in the gospel extracts from recent weeks, to correct. Then, they begin to have political ambitions themselves and let the cat out of the bag by arguing within earshot. Jesus commends childlikeness as a proper response to God and all God wants of them, as an antidote to ambition and politicking of any kind.
