### Mass Readings for Easter Sunday April 21st 2019

#### Acts 10: 34, 37-43

Peter opened his mouth... Poor Peter often opened his mouth and put both feet in as we say. This time he gets it right. He tells the story in miniature. Jesus came; he taught; he conquered and offers the possibility of victory to all who believe, through reconciliation and through God's gracious and generous gift of forgiveness and healing.

#### Psalm 117: 1-2, 16-17, 22-23

This day was made by the Lord; we rejoice and are glad.

#### Colossians 3:1-4

We are citizens of two dimensions. We are forced by necessity to deal with things temporal but our most prized aspirations are spiritual, intangible. St Paul reminds us that it is all about life. We are invited to 'set our minds' on the promise of eternal life, hidden within us, rising up within and among us and with the possibility of blooming forth at the end. We focus on the Christ who is our life.

#### John 20: 1-9

We are an Easter people. Calvary has cancelled Eden. The fruit of Christ's passion is the sweet taste of eternity. Our journey from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday is a template of all that is life. The destination of our journey; of our pilgrimage through life is nothing less than Christ's Easter Gift of victory and Eternal Life.
