#### **Mass Readings for Sunday June 9th 2019**

##### **Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11**

Luke describes the descent of the Holy Spirit on the apostles on Pentecost Day and the powerful effect it had on them. The Jewish feast of Pentecost was one of the three major pilgrim festivals of Israel. The fact that it was a pilgrim feast explains why devout Jews from every nation were in Jerusalem at this time. Since the account in Greek does not use gender-specific language we can conclude that women, men and children were all present.

##### **Psalms 103: 1, 24, 29-31, 34**

Send forth your Spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth.

##### **Romans 8:8-17**

This reading consists of three different, yet related themes: an acclamation that Jesus is Lord; a clear statement that there is a variety of gifts within the Christian community; the body metaphor that characterises that diversity of gifts. The metaphor of the human body emphasises the importance of unity in diversity rather than uniformity.

##### **John 20:19-23**

In his Gospel, John treats the resurrection and the bestowal of the Spirit upon the disciples of Jesus as having occurred on the same day, since we are told the event described took place 'on the evening of the first day of the week' (v.9). However, it is important to point out that there was not a twofold initial solemn bestowal of the Spirit. Luke and John have the same overall message: the risen Lord gives the gift of the Spirit, and inaugurates the mission of the Church. Each of them has his own particular theological emphasis. Now the design of God has been brought to a conclusion as God sends his Spirit to fill the earth with God's power and the disciples of Jesus are authorised to continue the mission of Jesus.
